A full time student and mother of two loving boys, **Britney Goodell** started volunteering with the food pantry because of her interests in nutrition and community service.

Almost every week, Britney can be found at the pantry stocking shelves, sorting food, and assisting clients during open hours. She also spends time outside of the pantry developing healthy (and delicious!) recipes to share with clients, as well as organizing initiatives that will benefit the children who visit the pantry. Additionally, Britney has played a crucial role in planning our upcoming Music for Meals fundraiser.

Britney says she hopes to see the community “grow, in a health conscious sense” and that all residents of Coralville can have food on the table.
